

## Frequently Asked Questions—École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary

### General

- Q When will the replacement school open?**  
École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary's replacement school is anticipated to open in 2018.
- Q How do I register my child at the replacement school?**  
Registration for new students and Kindergarten students will continue as normal. Kindergarten registration begins in January of the year that the student is to begin school. For more information please phone the school directly (780-922-2066).
- Q What grades will the replacement school accommodate?**  
The replacement school will provide both English and French Immersion programming for students in Kindergarten to Grade 6. The school will also offer PALS, which is the [Play and Learn at School program](#).
- Q What will be the capacity of the replacement school?**  
The replacement school for École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary will open with a capacity of 650 and be expandable to accommodate 700 students.
- Q What other schools within EIPS offer similar French programming as École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary?**  
The French Immersion program at École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary is a dual-track English and French Immersion program, in that both French Immersion and non-French Immersion students attend the school. Two other elementary French Immersion schools exist within Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS)—École Campbelltown in Sherwood Park and École Parc Élémentaire in Fort Saskatchewan. Both of these schools are single-track French Immersion schools and only offer French Immersion programming.
- Q Will there be community space available in the replacement school?**  
Yes, the replacement school will offer after-hours rentals. School space is determined in consultation with the school and EIPS Facility Services.

### Communication

- Q Was any public consultations or engagement efforts conducted for the design of the replacement school?**  
Yes, École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary circulated a survey in November 2014 to gather input from a variety of stakeholders on important features to consider in the design of the replacement school. In total, 115 responses were received. The survey responses were reviewed by a committee of stakeholder representatives—including parents, students, school staff, and Division personnel—who worked with the architect firm on the design of the replacement school. The information that came forward from the survey was used to assist the design process, as much as possible, within the parameters set out by Alberta Infrastructure's school-

design templates—Alberta Infrastructure outlines requirements and specification for the design of any new school or replacement school.

On March 22, 2016, a Replacement School Information Session was held by the Division, which offered the school community an opportunity to view the replacement school's [design concept](#) and [site plan](#).

**Q What opportunities will be available for future input?**

École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary will continue to post regular updates on its website throughout the replacement school project. Please visit [www.ardrossanelementary.ca](http://www.ardrossanelementary.ca) for news on the project and opportunities to share your input.

**Q How will parents continue to be updated on the school construction process and important information relating to the replacement school?**

## Planning and Construction

**Q When will construction begin on the replacement school?**

In the fall of 2015, Facility Services hired Pinchin Group, an environmental consultant, to execute the needed abatement work. The abatement work will begin in May 2016. Once complete, the demolition phase will take place—likely in the summer 2016.

With the design and site plan now determined, the Division is in the process of hiring a general contractor. Once the successful contractor is awarded for the construction project, timelines for the various phases of development will be finalized. EIPS expects the construction phase to commence in October 2016.

**Q When will construction end on the replacement school?**

The replacement school for École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary is scheduled to be complete by the end of 2017.

**Q Are drawings or rendering of the replacement school ready for the public view?**

The design plan is now complete. EIPS recently shared these plans with the school community at a Replacement School Information Session on March 22, 2016. To view the plans, visit <http://ardrossanelementary.ca/download/74908>.

**Q Why did EIPS decide to build a replacement school as opposed to simply renovating the current facility?**

When an existing school is being considered for a modernization project, a needs assessment is automatically conducted by the Division's Facility Services staff, Alberta Education, and Alberta Infrastructure. A cost analysis then follows on all required modernization work. If the cost of modernization is more than 75 per cent of the cost of building a replacement school, the school

jurisdiction can choose to prioritize the project as a replacement school capital project rather than a modernization. In the case of École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary, EIPS and government representatives determined it was more efficient, and more cost effective, to build a replacement school as opposed to modernizing the current facility.

**Q Why is the capacity of the replacement school smaller than the current school?**

The size of the replacement school was decided by Alberta Education, not by EIPS. That decision was based on current enrolment numbers, population projections, and existing school-design standards. Using current population projections and planning forecasts from Strathcona County, Alberta Education and Alberta Infrastructure determined a school with an opening capacity of 650—that is expandable to accommodate 700 students—will meet the needs for the community now, and into the future. It should also be noted, the replacement school will be more efficient in design and will offer all the education spaces required to meet the needs of its students.

**Q Do the plans for the replacement school take into account projected growth rates for the community?**

Yes, both the latest population projections and Area Structure Plans for the region were shared with Alberta Education and Alberta Infrastructure. The government analyzed that data to determine the total amount of funding dollars it would grant EIPS for the replacement school at École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary.

**Q How will students be impacted during the construction of the replacement school?**

Classes will continue as usual throughout the construction process. The 10 modular classrooms that were attached to the northern portion of the school have already been removed. Since there is enough classroom space for all École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary students within the main core of the existing school building it will be used for all school activities throughout the construction phase. Outside, the school's two playgrounds will be moved and relocated once the replacement school is built.

**Q Are there plans for multi-use trails in the surrounding community, or along Highway 824 in front of the school, that would enable easy access for families wishing to bike or walk to the school?**

Yes, there is a paved trail behind École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary and Ardrossan Junior Senior High. The trail provides ease of access from Highway 824 and connects to the Ardrossan Recreation Complex and the various residential neighbourhoods that border both the school and recreation centre. At this time, there are no other immediate plans for additional trails.

**Q What size are the classrooms?**

It's anticipated each classroom in the replacement school will be, on average, 80 square metres in size and designed to follow the provincial standard.

**Q Will the replacement school be able to accommodate future modularity?**

The replacement school for École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary will open with a capacity of

650 and be expandable to accommodate 700 students, through the addition of modulars.

**Q What are some of the special features the replacement school will have?**

The replacement school will be fully modernized and will provide the best learning environments for students. Some of the exciting new features include flex space for students, a Hot Lunch kitchen, a conference room, removable walls, a data centre, learning commons, a student production studio, and a state-of-the-art gymnasium.

**Q What education features of the old school will not be included in the replacement school?**

Instead of building two separate gymnasiums, the replacement school will feature one gymnasium. It will be a completely modernized facility and, at 595 square metres, meets the current guidelines put out by Alberta Education.

## Hot Lunch Program

**Q Will a Hot Lunch Program be offered at the replacement school?**

Yes, the replacement school will continue to offer a Hot Lunch Program. The Hot Lunch Program is currently used by a large percentage of the school population and was one of the considerations brought forward by a number of stakeholders during the design-consultation phase. In designing the replacement school, space will be assigned for a kitchen space for the Hot Lunch Program.

**Q During the construction phase will a Hot Lunch Program be offered?**

Yes, the Hot Lunch Program will continue throughout the various construction phases. It will be offered three days a week and parents can order what they want online by visiting [www.aeslunchbox.com/admin/?sid=&un=0](http://www.aeslunchbox.com/admin/?sid=&un=0).

## Student Transportation

**Q Will school bus pickup and drop-off locations change?**

EIPS Student Transportation provides bus service at no cost to eligible students who are attending their designated school. Alternate pickup and drop-off locations may be accommodated if they are along a designated bus route and located within the École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary attendance boundary. Kindergarten to Grade 6 students may be expected to walk up to 250 metres to their designated pickup or drop-off location.

**Q Is it possible to have different bus pickup and drop-off locations?**

**Q Will there be a new parking lot and bus loop designed?**

The design of the replacement school and surrounding area includes the development of a parking lot and restructuring traffic flow. However, the bus loop at the current school will not be replaced. It will be maintained and will continue to be used at the replacement school.

Student safety and efficient traffic flow are key considerations in the design of the parking lots, bus loops, and drop-off/pickup zones. To view the plans, visit

**Q Will there be a cost for busing service?**

Students residing greater than 2.4 kilometres from their designated school do not pay a fee for busing. Busing at no cost will also be extended to those students attending their designated school who live less than 2.4 kilometres but have to walk along a road with posted speeds of 60 kilometres per hour and up, without the benefits of a sidewalk.

If a student wishes to access EIPS transportation and lives less than 2.4 kilometres from their designated school, he/she is automatically subject to a Payride fee. Students wishing to access non-designated transportation are automatically subject to a non-designated fee in addition to a Payride fee. ## Child Care

**Q What is happening with Our Little Friends/Les Petits Amis Preschool and Ardrossan Out of School Care?**

As we understand, both providers are currently operating out of new spaces. The lease agreement between Our Little Friends/Les Petits Amis Preschool and École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary expired June 30, 2015. The lease agreement between Ardrossan Out of School Care and École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary expired August 31, 2015. For more information, please contact the child care providers directly.

**Q Why did EIPS not renew the lease for Our Little Friends/Les Petits Amis Preschool and Ardrossan Out of School Care?**

Alberta Education funds schools and the delivery of programming for Kindergarten to Grade 12 children. Monies for childcare facilities is currently outside of the mandate of Alberta Education and school authorities. The funding school divisions receive for school construction projects is to provide instructional space for students. There is little flexibility for additional spaces within schools outside of the parameters set by Alberta Education and Alberta Infrastructure. The location of those leased child care spaces is in a portion of the school that the abatement process is taking place in. To ensure the construction process begins on schedule, all lease agreements for the school were not renewed for the 2015-2016 school year.

**Q Why is space for Our Little Friends/Les Petits Amis Preschool and Ardrossan Out of School Care not included in the design of the replacement school?**

While it's unfortunate EIPS could not renew the leases for either businesses it was not an EIPS decision. Alberta Education is focused on the funding of schools and the delivery of programming for Kindergarten to Grade 12 children. Funding for childcare facilities is currently outside of the mandate of Alberta Education and school authorities. The replacement school for École Élémentaire Ardrossan Elementary simply will not have the space to house either facility.

**Q Is it possible to not demolish the entire building and keep the space currently dedicated to Our Little Friends/Les Petits Amis Preschool and Ardrossan Out of School Care intact?**

Unfortunately no, the school size is determined by Alberta Education, which is focused on the funding of schools and the delivery of programming for Kindergarten to Grade 12 children. Funding for child care facilities is currently outside of the mandate of Alberta Education and school authorities.

**Q How can I find an EIPS school that offers an out-of-school child care program, or other child care programs, in the community?**

**Q How do I enroll my child in a school out of my designated school boundary?**

Families have the option of enrolling their children in a non-designated school within EIPS. The process for doing so is outlined in the Division's boundary exemption request process posted online at [www.eips.ca/schools/boundaries/boundary-exemption-request-process](http://www.eips.ca/schools/boundaries/boundary-exemption-request-process). The timeframe for submitting boundary exemption requests is generally February 1 to mid-April of each year for the following fall. Registration in a non-designated school may be considered if there is space available in the requested school and/or program.
